

Prior to this period it was known indifferently by the names of Terra Australis, Austral Asia, or New Holland, according to the whim of the explorer or the historian. The first statutory recognition by the Imperial Parliament of the name Australia occurs in the Act 10 Geo. IV, c. 22, which refers to Western Australia on the western coast of New Holland. To understand the principle of the Australian Federation, it is necessary briefly to trace the creation and growth of the various States which comprise the Commonwealth and their constitutional development. The first step in the annexation of Australia was taken captain and . on the 23rd of August, 1770, by Captain Cook, the daring navigator, who had sailed up the river St. Lawrence just prior to Wolfes triumphant enterprise. On that day Captain Cook took formal possession of the eastern portion of the Continent from latitude 38 to latitude 10J-0 S, in the name of His Majesty King George III.
